TEAM NOTES

- The Cowboys win today over the Redskins was the team's first of the 2016 season and helped them move to 1-1 in overall record and in the NFC East.
- With the win, Dallas extended its streak to four consecutive wins in Washington dating back to 2013.
- Overall, the victory today, it marked the sixth consecutive win for the road team in the Washington/Dallas series. It ties the longest active streak in the NFL, and is the longest streak in the series.
- The Cowboys offense engineered a 94-yard touchdown drive on its second possession of the game to mark the longest scoring drive since going 95 yards at Seattle (9/16/12).
- Collectively, the Dallas offense boasted three different players with at least one rushing touchdown each from Ezekiel Elliott, Alfred Morris and Dak Prescott. The last time that happened was against New Orleans (11/25/10) when Miles Austin, Marion Barber and Tashard Choice each had one.
- With both Ezekiel Elliott and Dak Prescott each adding a rushing touchdown, it marked the first time a rookie running back and a rookie quarterback each scored a rushing touchdown in a single game in team history.

DAN BAILEY

- Dan Bailey had two field goals to become only the second kicker in team history to reach 150 for his career (Rafael Septien).

DEZ BRYANT

- Dez Bryant totaled 102 on seven catches to mark his 16th career 100-yard receiving game and the first since 104 yards against Philadelphia (11/8/15).

BARRY CHURCH

- Barry Church picked off Kirk Cousins in the fourth quarter to mark his fourth career interception and first since at the N.Y. Giants (11/23/14).

TRAVIS FREDERICK

- Travis Frederick played and started in his 50th career game.

DOUG FREE

- Doug Free made his 100th career start.

EZEKIEL ELLIOTT

- Ezekiel Elliott rushed 21 times for 83 yards and a touchdown.
- With a score today, Elliott became the first rookie running back for the Cowboys to rush for a touchdown in each of the first two games of the season. Last week, Elliott became only the fifth rookie in Cowboys history to rush for a touchdown in the first game of the season.

ALFRED MORRIS

- Alfred Morris rushed five times for seven yards and the game-winning touchdown. It was his first score as a Cowboy and the 30th of his career.

DAK PRESCOTT

- Dak Prescott became only the second Cowboys rookie quarterback to start the first two games of the season (Troy Aikman, 1989), and fifth rookie quarterback in the NFL drafted in the fourth round-or-later to start the team's first two games of the season, joining Randy Hedberg (Tampa Bay, 1977), Mike Pagel (Baltimore, 1982), Chris Weinke (Carolina, 2001) and Kyle Orton (Chicago, 2005).
- With the win, it marked the first time a Cowboys rookie quarterback has won a game since Drew Henson against Chicago (11/25/04).
- Prescott completed 22-of-30 passes for 292 yards with no touchdowns and no interceptions for a 103.8 quarterback rating.
- Prescott had one rush for a six-yard touchdown - his first career score (passing or rushing). It was only the third time a Dallas quarterback scored a rushing touchdown in a game during his rookie campaign (Roger Staubach 1969; Quincy Carter 2001):

- Jason Witten had 51 receiving yards to give him 1,374 career receiving yards against the Washington Redskins to surpass Tony Hill (1,355) for the second-most receiving yards by a Cowboy against Washington in the series history.
