TEAM NOTES

- Today's win gave the Cowboys their sixth straight win - the longest winning streak during a single season since winning six in a row at the beginning of the 2014 regular season. Dallas improved to 6-1 on the 2016 season - the 11th time in franchise history and first since 2014.
- It is the third time Dallas has started the season 0-1 and gone onto win the next six games (1982, 2014).
- With the victory, Dallas' record improved to 19-9 after the bye week, 8-2 at home, and 5-1 against Philadelphia after the bye.
- It was also the Cowboys third straight win at AT&T Stadium - longest streak since the team won three in a row in 2014 (9/28-10/19).
- Dallas played in its 38th overtime game in the regular season. With the win, the Cowboys improved to 21-17 all-time in overtime games during the regular season while snapping a three-game losing streak in overtime games. Dallas last won an overtime game against New Orleans (10/5/14).
- It was also the first non-field goal overtime win since at Kansas City (10/11/09).
- The victory was the Cowboys second straight win on Sunday Night Football and 29th overall, most all-time.
- With one rushing touchdowns today, Dallas has now produced 12 rushing touchdowns in 2016 to tie for fourth number through the first seven games in a season in team history:

- For the seventh straight game, the Dallas defense did not allow a 100-yard rusher or a 100-yard receiver against the opposing offense. It is one-of-two teams (Minnesota plays on Monday night) in the NFL to not allow a 100-yard rusher or 100-yard receiver in a single game. It is also the longest such streak since the team had nine-straight games in the 2009 season (9/28/09-11/26/09).

DAN BAILEY

- Dan Bailey made three field goals to extend his franchise-best mark to 24 career games with three-or-more field goals.

COLE BEASLEY

- Cole Beasley caught four passes for 53 yards – three for first downs - and attempted his first career pass in the fourth quarter that fell incomplete.

DEZ BRYANT

- Dez Bryant caught four passes for 113 yards and a touchdown.
- Bryant's 100-yard receiving game was the 17th of his career, sixth-most by a Cowboys receiver in team history.
- With his yardage output tonight, Bryant (6,088) became the sixth player in team history to reach 6,000 career yards. By doing so in his 88th career game, he became the third-fastest to reach that mark:

- Barry Church reached 500 career tackles.

TYRONE CRAWFORD

- Tyrone Crawford registered his second career multi-sack game with 1.5 takedowns while also collecting his second career fumble recovery and second of the season.

EZEKIEL ELLIOTT

- Ezekiel Elliott rushed 22 times for 96 yards.
- Elliott's 799 rushing yards are the most by a Cowboys rookie rusher during his first seven games:

- By not rushing for 100 yards today, Elliott’s streak of consecutive games over the century mark was stopped at four – tied for the second-longest streak in team history by a running back overall:

CHRIS JONES

- Chris Jones took a fake punt in the third quarter and logged his first career rush for 30 yards and a first down on fourth-and-eight that led to a field goal. It was the third-longest rush by a Cowboys punter in team history:

DAK PRESCOTT

- Dak Prescott became the first Cowboys rookie quarterback to start the first seven games of the season, and third rookie quarterback in the NFL drafted in the fourth round-or-later to start the team’s first seven games of the season, joining Chris Weinke (Carolina, 2001) and Kyle Orton (Chicago, 2005).
- With the win, Prescott improved to 6-1, the best to start a career by a Cowboys rookie, and allowed Dallas to become the first team since the 1970 merger to win six-or-more out of their first seven games with a rookie starting quarterback.

- Prescott completed 19-of-39 passes for 287 yards with two touchdowns and one interception for a 79.8 quarterback rating.
- Prescott also rushed seven times for 38 yards and a touchdown. His score gave him four rushing touchdowns on the season to tie for the second-most by a Cowboys quarterback in a single season in franchise history

- By failing to record a quarterback rating of 100.0-or-better, Prescott’s streak of consecutive games with 100.0 rating ended at five games – longest streak and most games in franchise history by a rookie quarterback – and tied with Ben Roethlisberger (2004) and Robert Griffin III (2012) as the longest streak by a rookie quarterback in NFL history:

- With 287 passing yards in tonight's contest, Prescott (currently at 1,773 yards on the season) surpassed Chad Hutchinson (1,555 – 2002) and Troy Aikman (1,749) for the most passing yards by a Cowboys rookie quarterback during his first pro season:

- Prescott's two touchdowns gave him nine on the season to tie Aikman (9 – 1989) for the most passing touchdowns by a Cowboys rookie quarterback.
- Prescott's 19 completions (currently at 144) allowed him to pass Chad Hutchinson (127 - 2002) for third amongst Cowboys rookie quarterbacks all-time.

TERRANCE WILLIAMS

- Terrance Williams caught two passes for 25 yards to give him 2,550 career receiving yards to pass Mel Renfro (2,525) for 20th on the team's all-time receiving yards list.

JASON WITTEN

- Jason Witten made his 204th career start to pass Ed "Too Tall" Jones (203, 1974-78, 1980-89) for the most games started in franchise history.
- Witten also made his 154th consecutive start to tie Lee Roy Jordan (154) for the most in team history.
- Witten caught the game-winning touchdown to break a tie with Jerry Smith (60) for sole possession of fifth on the league's all-time receiving touchdowns list amongst tight ends.
- Witten's game-winner was the first by a Cowboys tight end in overtime since Billy Joe DuPree in the franchise's first over time game against St. Louis (9/28/75).
