TEAM NOTES

- Today's win gave the Cowboys their seventh straight win - the longest winning streak during a single season since winning seven during the 2007 regular season, and tied the second-longest win streak during the regular season in team history:

- It is also the first time in franchise history that Dallas has started the season 0-1 and gone on to win the next seven games.
- The win also improved the Cowboys 2016 record against the AFC North to 2-0, extended the current overall win streak against the division to four and gave Dallas its 97th win against the AFC - tops in the NFC.
- Dallas' 25-point victory was the largest margin of victory since a 35-point win (42-7) against Indianapolis (12/21/14).

- With 21 points in the first half of today's game, the Cowboys have now scored 129 first half points through eight games on the season, the fourth-highest first half scoring output through eight games in Cowboys history:

- With two rushing touchdowns today, Dallas has now produced 14 rushing scores in 2016 to tie the second-highest number through the first eight games in a season in team history:

- Dallas' 29 first downs and 15 passing first downs were both the highest numbers of the 2016 season.
- For the eighth straight game, the Dallas defense did not allow a 100-yard rusher or a 100-yard receiver against the opposing offense. It is the only team in the NFL to not allow a 100-yard rusher or 100-yard receiver in a single game. It is also the longest such streak since the team had nine-straight games in the 2009 season (9/28/09-11/26/09).
- The Cowboys held the Browns to a season-low 10 points, the fewest since allowing 10 points at Philadelphia (9/20/15), and have now allowed 23 points-or-less in each of their first eight games for the first time since 1994.
- Entering this game, Cleveland's offense had 33 carries of 10-plus yards, which was second in the NFL. Dallas' defense did not allow any runs of 10-plus yards in this game.

DAN BAILEY

- Dan Bailey had five points to surpass 700 career points. He became the third Cowboy – second kicker (Rafael Septien) - to reach that mark:

COLE BEASLEY

- Cole Beasley made six receptions for 56 yards and a touchdown to pass Walt Garrison (182) and Lance Rentzel (183) for 23rd on the team's all-time receptions list.

DEZ BRYANT

- By not recording a touchdown in today's contest, Bryant snapped his streak of consecutive games with a touchdown reception against an AFC opponent at 14 – the longest interconference streak in the NFL since the 1970 merger.

MALIEK COLLINS

- Maliek Collins had 2.0 sacks against Cody Kessler to mark the first time a rookie defender recorded two-plus sacks in a single game since DeVonte Holloman had 2.0 against Philadelphia (12/29/13). DeMarcus Ware owns the rookie record with 3.0 sacks against Carolina (12/24/05).

EZEKIEL ELLIOTT

- Ezekiel Elliott rushed 18 times for 92 yards and two touchdowns.
- Elliott's 891 rushing yards are the most by a Cowboys rookie rusher during his first eight games:

- Elliott's 891 yards are also the third-most overall by an NFL player in his first eight career games in NFL history:

- Elliott is the third player in NFL history to rush for 875-plus yards and seven touchdowns in first career games, joining Eric Dickerson (1983) and Adrian Peterson (2007).
- On the season, Elliott's 891 rushing yards are the fifth-highest by a rookie in team history:

- Elliott scored two rushing touchdowns today to mark his second career multi-touchdown game. By doing so, he tied for the third-most games in a single season by a Cowboys rookie in team history:

DAK PRESCOTT

- Dak Prescott became the first Cowboys rookie quarterback to start the first eight games of the season, and third rookie quarterback in the NFL drafted in the fourth round-or-later to start the team's first eight games of the season, joining Chris Weinke (Carolina, 2001) and Kyle Orton (Chicago, 2005).
- Prescott's eight starts tied Quincy Carter (2001) for the third-most starts by a Cowboys rookie quarterback in team history, while his eight total games played tied Steve Walsh (1989) and Carter (2001) for third.
- With the win, Prescott improved to 7-1, the best record to start a career by a Cowboys rookie quarterback, and joined Johnny Lujack (1948 Chicago Bears) as the second rookie to start a career winning seven of his first eight starts.

- Prescott is the third rookie quarterback with a seven game winning streak since the 1970 NFL merger joining Ben Roethlisberger (Pittsburgh 2004) and Kyle Orton (Chicago 2005).
- Prescott completed 21-of-27 passes for 247 yards with three touchdowns and no interceptions for a 141.8 quarterback rating.
- Prescott scored a 141.8 rating to mark his sixth game with a 100.0 rating to tie for fourth by a rookie quarterback in a single season in NFL history:

- Prescott became the first rookie in NFL history to have six starts with a 100-plus passer rating in his team's first eight games of a season.
- Prescott's 141.8 quarterback rating in today's game was the highest by a Cowboys rookie quarterback in a single game (minimum 10 pass attempts):

- Prescott's 77.8 completion percentage (21-of-27 passes) was the second-highest by a Cowboys rookie quarterback in team history (minimum 10 passing attempts):

- Prescott's 80% completion rate (12-of-15 att) tied himself (80% vs. Chi, 9/25/16) for the highest first half completion percentage by a Cowboys rookie quarterback since 1991.
- Prescott's 247 passing yards in today's game tied the ninth-highest by a Cowboys rookie quarterback in franchise history:

- Prescott's three touchdowns gave him 12 on the season to to break a tie with Troy Aikman, 9 1989, for the most passing touchdowns by a Cowboys rookie quarterback.

- Prescott threw for three touchdowns, tied for the most this season and tied his previous mark for the second-highest by a Cowboys rookie quarterback in team history. With this being his second game of the season with three-plus touchdown passes, he established a franchise record for a rookie quarterback:

- Prescott’s 21 completions gave him 165 on the season and allowed him to pass Aikman (155 - 1989) for the most by a Cowboys rookie quarterback.

MARK SANCHEZ

- Mark Sanchez made his Cowboys debut and completed his first pass on the season for eight yards.

JASON WITTEN

- Jason Witten made his 155th consecutive start to break a tie with Lee Roy Jordan (154) for the most in team history.
- Witten caught eight passes for 134 yards and one touchdown.
- It marked Witten’s first 100-yard receiving game since against Philadelphia (12/29/13) and was the 21st of his career, tied for third-most by a tight end in NFL history.
- Witten became the fifth tight end with a 100-yard game at 34 years-or-older, joining Tony Gonzalez, Shannon Sharpe, Wesley Walls and Ben Watson.
- Witten caught one touchdown to reach 62 for his career and tie Shannon Sharpe (62) for fourth on the league’s all-time receiving touchdowns list amongst tight ends.
