TEAM NOTES

- Today's win gave the Cowboys their ninth straight to break a tie with the 1977 team for the longest regular season winning streak during a single season in team history:

- The win also tied the second-longest win streak, including combined seasons, in team history:

- It is also the first time in franchise history that Dallas has started the season 0-1 and gone on to win the next nine games.
- The win also closed out the Cowboys 2016 record against the AFC North at a perfect 4-0 - the first time Dallas has gone undefeated against that division, and it is the first time the Cowboys have swept all four AFC Divisional opponents since the AFC South in 2014. They also extended the current overall win streak against the division to six and gave Dallas its 99th win against the AFC - tops in the NFC.
- It was also the Cowboys first victory over the Ravens, the only team Dallas previously did not have a win against, while snapping a four-game losing streak against them.
- After accumulating 417 total net yards today, the Cowboys reached 4,131 yards on the season. By crossing the 4,000-yard barrier in the team's 10th game, the 2016 Dallas offense became only the second team in franchise history to hit that mark in its first 10 games of the season, joining the 1966 team and the 4,131 yards are the most during that timespan between the two:

- By hitting 400 yards for the eighth straight game, the Dallas offense tied New England (2007) and Denver (2013) for the longest single-season streak in NFL history:

- For the 10th straight game, the Dallas defense did not allow a 100-yard rusher, the only team in the NFL in 2016 to not allow a 100-yard rusher in a single game.

DAN BAILEY

- Dan Bailey had two field goals to give him 163 for his career and surpass Rafael Septien (162) for the most field goals made in team history:

COLE BEASLEY

- Cole Beasley had 59 yards on five catches to give him 591 receiving yards on the season to surpass his 2015 season receiving yardage total (536) and establish a career-high for receiving yards in a single season.
- Beasley's 59 yards in today's game gave him 2,043 career receiving yards to become the 30th player in team history to reach 2,000 career receiving yards.
- Beasley made five receptions to give him 191 for his career and tie Patrick Crayton (196) for 21st on the team's all-time receptions list.
- Beasley caught one touchdown to give him five on the season and tie his career-high single-season total.

DEZ BRYANT

- Dez Bryant caught six passes for 80 yards and two touchdowns.
- Bryant's two scores marked his 14th career multi-touchdown game, second-most in team history:

JUSTIN DURANT

- Justin Durant's tackle total in today's game allowed him to reach 800 for his career.

EZEKIEL ELLIOTT

- Ezekiel Elliott rushed 25 times for 97 yards.
- Elliott's 97 yards in today's game gave him 1,102 for the season and allowed him to surpass Tony Dorsett (1,007) for the most yards by a rookie rusher in franchise history:

- Elliott's 25 carries gave him 223 on the season and allowed him to pass Don Perkins (200 – 1961), Calvin Hill (204 – 1969) and Tony Dorsett (208 – 1977) for the second-most carries by a rookie runner in team history, trailing only Emmitt Smith (241 – 1990):

CHRIS JONES

- Chris Jones had two punts downed inside the 20-yard line to become the fifth player in team history to reach 100 in a career.

SEAN LEE

- Sean Lee's tackle totals allowed him to surpass 100 tackles on the season with today's defensive performance to mark his third consecutive season – fourth overall - with 100-plus tackles.

DAK PRESCOTT

- Dak Prescott became the first Cowboys rookie quarterback to start the first 10 games of the season, and second rookie quarterback in the NFL drafted in the fourth round-or-later to start the team's first 10 games of the season, joining Kyle Orton (Chicago, 2005).
- By making his 10th start and 10th game played, he surpassed Chad Hutchinson (9/9 – 2002) for the second-most starts and second-most games played by a Cowboys rookie quarterback in team history.
- With the win, Prescott improved to 9-1, the best record to start a career by a Cowboys rookie quarterback, and joined Johnny Lujack (1948 Chicago Bears) as the second rookie to start a career and win nine of his first 10 starts.
- With the victory, Prescott reached his ninth straight win and broke a tie with Orton (8 – 2005) for the second-most consecutive wins by a rookie quarterback in a single season in NFL history:

- Prescott completed 27-of-36 passes for 301 yards with three touchdowns and no interceptions for a 127.2 quarterback rating.
- Prescott scored a 127.2 rating to mark his eighth game with a 100.0 rating to tie for second by a rookie quarterback in a single season in NFL history:

- Prescott's 300-yard game was his second of the season – second consecutive – to establish a Cowboys rookie record for most 300-yard passing games in a single season:

- By throwing for 300-or-more yards in his second consecutive game, Prescott became the fourth quarterback – first rookie – to have a streak of two-or-more games with 300-plus passing yards in team history. He is the first to do it since Tony Romo had a two-game streak against Pittsburgh (12/16/12) and against New Orleans (12/23/16).
- Prescott threw for three touchdowns, tied for the most this season in a single game and the highest by a Cowboys rookie quarterback in team history. With this being his third game of the season with three-plus touchdown passes, he extended a franchise record by a Cowboys rookie quarterback and tied for third-most overall by an NFL rookie quarterback since the 1970 merger:

- By throwing three touchdowns today, it marked Prescott's fifth consecutive multi-touchdown game to extend his club record.
- Prescott's 36 attempts gave him 316 on the season to surpass Troy Aikman (293 – 1989) for the most attempts by a Cowboys rookie quarterback in franchise history:

- Jason Witten had 37 receiving yards on five catches today to give him 520 on the season to mark his 13th career and 13th consecutive 500-yard season while becoming only the eighth player – second tight end – to accomplish that feat:
