It was his 27th game with at least three field goals made - the most in team history and fourth by a kicker since 2011. Hit his lone PAT try and had four touchbacks on six kickoffs.

at Denver (9/17) Tied his career long with a 56-yard field goal.

- Led the team in scoring for the sixth overall and sixth consecutive season, finishing 2016 with 127 points.
- Elected as a team captain for the 2016 season.
- His 30 field goals made in 2015 are fourth in a season in team history and second in his career and his 93.8 field goal percentage (30-of-32) is tops in his career, second in team history.
- Tied with Josh Brown for the lead in field goal percentage in 2015.
- Selected to his first career Pro Bowl in 2015.
