- vs. Detroit (9/30)** Led the way for Elliott's 152 rushing yards on 25 carries (6.1) as he finished with 240 total yards. Prescott threw for 255 yards and two touchdowns on 17-of-27 passes with three sacks and a season-best 118.6 rating.
- at Houston (10/7)** Blocked for 292 net yards, including 208 through the air and 98 on the ground.
- vs. Jacksonville (10/14)** Blocked for Elliott's third 100-yard day of the season (106) as the offense had 206 rushing yards and controlled the clock for 38:50.

Prescott threw for a season-high 289 yards on 22-of-31 passing (71.0) with two touchdowns, adding one on the ground.
- vs. New Orleans (11/29)** The offense controlled the ball for 36:53 and went 50.0% on third downs (seven-of-14), beating the Saints. Elliott totaled 136 yards (75 rush, 60 rec.) with one receiving score, and Prescott completed 24-of-28 (85.7%) passes, including a career-long (second in team history) 18 consecutive.
- vs. Philadelphia (12/9)** Blocked for 576 net yards - fourth in team history - while helping give Dallas a 400-yard passer, 200-yard receiver and 100-yard rusher for the first time in franchise history. The club also had a record 45:33 time of possession in the win.
- Started all 16 games for the first time in his career in 2017, helping block for an offense that topped 2,000 rushing yards in consecutive seasons.
- In 2016 placed on Reserve/Injured with a toe injury on Oct. 5.
